#### You are the Gift....Live like it!

"For this reason I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you through the laying on of my hands." 2 Timothy 1.16

Now that Christmas has come and gone and all the presents under the tree have been opened and most of the decorations have been put away for another year; I want you to consider the fact that one of the most important gifts you have is YOU! You are the gift. I know this must sound like I've gone and drank from the "self-help, pop psychology waters" but I truly mean it when I say that you are the gift! And that being the case you are meant to be shared.

Sometimes we don't feel like much of a gift. We can find ourselves constantly being envious of others who seem to have so much more to offer; but the truth is that each and every one of us has been given not only talents and resources, but more importantly each one of us has been claimed by God for the sake of the world. That means that we not only have a purpose, but that our lives matter.

So this year, instead of making a "New Year's resolution" or embarking on some grand program of self-enrichment, I want you to wake up each and every morning with this thought—"I am the gift!" Now, don't let this go to your head. After all we Lutherans are known for our humility, but just imagine what a difference it would make to keep those four little words as your personal motto for 2015. How might this look?

Scenario number one is that you are sitting at the common dinner table, or perhaps in a doctor's waiting room or just outside on the patio when someone comes up to you and just begins to talk. Nonstop they continue to the point where you quite honestly are considering faking an illness in order to get away! But then you remember, "I am the gift!" Perhaps this person is simply lonely, or friendless, or maybe just excited and wants to share with another human being. Your act of listening and patience is probably going to be the most important gift that

person could receive. Don't be annoyed, smile that God can use you in such a wonderful way!

Or what about the opportunity to teach Sunday School, or coach little league, or participate in the Boys and Girls club? Everyone is busy yet you take the time to actually connect with a little one. Your love and genuine care are remembered by this child for the rest of their lives and in fact become the stimulus for their own involvement for the good and welfare of children. You are the gift! You have put into motion things that you might never live to see, or realize that you have done—yet without you they would not have happened.

And let's make sure we talk about our resources and how we use them. Our dollars and assets that we contribute to the ministry of the church are a precious gift. I will never know to what extent the dollars I give have impacted lives—but I know that they have! Fresh water in India, food in Somalia, housing in America, relief for refugees in Syria, compassion to orphans in Haiti and resources for peace makers throughout the world—all of this has happened because of the money I have given through Our Savior's. And of course this does not include the impact of the Gospel! How the words of Jesus have come to change and transform lives.

Please, every morning when you get up remind yourself that YOU ARE THE GIFT! God is waiting and willing to use you to bless the world.



# **January Family Devotion:**

#### JOY FOR THE NEW YEAR!

Teach your children about joy: Wrap small amounts of money in individual packages, and give one to each child. Encourage them to guess what's inside. After they unwrap it, help them consider how they will use the money — tithe, save and spend. Then remind them to say thank you.

Explain how God gives people His joy — a daily offering. Ask children to look at joy as a gift.

**Anticipate it.** Discuss what kinds of gifts God wants to give them.

**Unwrap it.** Explain how prayer and reading the Bible are ways they can receive joy. Knowing that they are God's children, that He loves them and that He wants what is best for them brings joy.

**Use it.** Joy is not happiness but can be in them at all times — during easy as well as difficult days. They can share it with others because God is the provider. Children can show joy through good attitudes, helpfulness and thankfulness.

**Thank the Giver.** Remind children to tell God "thank You" for daily giving them His joy.

#### Review

- 1. What did we compare to joy? (Wrapped gift)
- 2. People can only have happiness during good times. When can you have joy? (During good and bad times)
- 3. What is one way to be joyful when good or bad things happen? (Thank God for the good things He has given you and remember He loves you.)
- 4. How do you share joy with others? (Through good attitudes, helpfulness and thankfulness.)

Dear Church Family,


