"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Matthew 6:21 NRSV

I tell the story all the time about my Grandfather who when the preacher would begin to talk about money, he would lean over and say: "Here comes the sermon on the amount!" It's a good one that I still use and still brings a chuckle. I've never been uptight or embarrassed about talking about money, in fact I find it kind of fun as it often leads to discussions about even deeper things. Talking about money can reveal our fears, our priorities, a bit about our family of origin and even help to diagnose our spiritual health.

Jesus had a lot to say about money; but of all the things he said the above words from Matthew 6 always seem to be the least intuitive—but the most true. You see in our romantic world view we like to think that our money will follow our heart. Now think about all the good things that you heart would simply love to support: the poor animals who have no homes, the children who are starving, the scouts, the choirs, you alma mater, your favorite charities, your favorite ministries (including your church). Now take a look at your bank statement, how much of your treasure has followed your heart?

In Eugene Peterson's translation of the Bible he puts Matthew 6:21 this way: "It's obvious, isn't it? The place where your treasure is, is the place you will most want to be, and end up being." It's obvious. I put my treasure in my house, in my boat, in my 401K (retirement), in my cars, in my vacations, in my children. And those places where I've invested myself, those are the place in which I want to be. And there is nothing wrong with investing yourself in several places. I fully admit for the last 4 years I've invested a lot of time and energy serving as a coach at the High School. And of course here is the reality the more I invest my time, my resources, my talents into my work at the High School, well the more I want to be there, to be a part of what is going on and stay connected.

The same is true of our life here at Our Savior's. If

you need an invitation, then I want to invite you. If you need a challenge, then I challenge you—to invest yourself in our mission and ministry here at OSLC. If you have a dream about doing a particular ministry, then I want you to come and invest time, talent and resources to make that happen. If you have a passion for something that we are already doing then I want you to get more involved. I want you to invest in OSLC! I want you to invest with your time, your talents and your money! If you want to know how you can invest yourself in our common ministry, just drop me an email, or come by to chat and I'll give you ten things you can do right now! (I'll give you the name of someone to visit, I'll give you a prayer concern; I'll give you a volunteer opportunity; I'll give you permission to do some painting; I'll show you where the weeds could be pulled; I'll tell you when the next Bible study will meet; I'll connect you to our school where you can: read, help with recess, be a lunch volunteer, or set up traffic cones; I'll tell you where we could use some money (I have uses for \$10 to \$100,000,000); I can connect you with a task group for a one time opportunity (decorating, serving, baking etc..); I can even connect you to become a missionary in a foreign country! Investors wanted!

Why? Is there some crisis? Some major shortfall or panic around the church? NO! But Jesus was right: where our treasure is, where we have invested ourselves that is where our hearts will be. And here's my confession. I want your heart for the Lord and I'm afraid that won't happen unless we follow his words from Matthew 6:21.



- We will continue to enjoy special music throughout the summer with solos, ensembles and instrumental music during our 10:30am service (10:00am in July/August)


We are so fortunate to have these wonderful musicians at our church. They share their gifts for the love of God.


For example: If you took envelope 78 you would write a check for \$78 and put that in the envelope!


