#### We are an Easter People!

"He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay." Matthew 28.6

As we remember the 500th anniversary of the Reformation I have used the newsletter to reflect a bit on our Lutheran heritage and how it continues to guard and inform our Christian faith. As we are approaching Easter, I thought it would be nice to share a paragraph from one of Martin Luther's Easter sermons. Here I must remind you of the pace in which Luther worked. During 11 days (Holy Week and days following Easter) Luther preached 18 sermons. It makes me a bit embarrassed that I have ever complained about the measly 6 that I will traditionally preach during the same time! At this time in his career Luther is at the top of his form as a preacher and regularly is in the pulpit of St. Mary's church in Wittenberg. Imagine in your mind Luther giving this sermon, and even though we are still in Lent, I give you permission to yell out a hearty ALLELUIA when you come to the end!

"You have heard in the Passion how Christ let himself be crucified and buried and how sin and death trampled him underfoot. Satan and the sins of the world lie on him in the tomb. Sin, death and the devil are his lord. Therefore you must look into his tomb and realize that my sins and my death tear him apart and oppress him. There the devil regards himself as secure, and the chief priests boast and rejoice: He is gone and will not return. But in the instant when they believe him destroyed, the Lion tears himself away from sin, death, hell, and the jaws of the devil and rips them to shreds with his teeth. This is our comfort, that Christ comes forth: Death, sin, and the devil cannot hold him. The sin of the

This is our comfort, that Christ comes forth: Death, sin, and the devil cannot hold him. The sin of the entire world is powerless. When he appears to Mary Magdalene, one sees in him neither death nor sin nor sadness but sheer life and joy. There I see that the Lord is mine and treads on the devil. Then I find my sins, torment, and devil where I ought to find them. There is the seed of the woman, who has struck the head of the serpent (Genesis 3:15), and says: Death,

you shall die; Hell, you shall be defeated! Here is the victor." *Martin Luther, Easter Sermon 1529*.

"This is our comfort, that Christ comes forth: Death, sin and the devil cannot hold him." What wondrous words! This indeed is our comfort! We do not find our comfort in personal deeds, in government, in riches, in powers or even in the goodness of our families and communities. Our comfort is found in the one who comes forth when all other comforts fail. Our comfort is found in the Risen Lord who having joined himself to humanity, and having become subject to all the darkness that would lord itself over us in order to crush our spirit and separate us from the love of God, in the midst of it's great power to produce fear and despair, this Lord comes forth—like a lion, Luther proclaims—to prove once and for all that love reigns and that the darkness will and must give way to the light of God through Christ!

These words of Easter hope burned in the belly of Luther and should burn in the belly of we who continue in this great reforming movement of the church. We are an Easter people! Let us never tire of reminding ourselves and the world that Christ has come forth, from the tomb to give us faith, hope and love! May the Lord of Easter show himself as we once again proclaim his victory!

#### Pastor Jeff Receives Grant for Sabbatical Study!

Lilly Endowment Clergy Renewal Programs

Pastor Jeff has been awarded full funding for his Sabbatical

Grant proposal by the "2016 Lilly Endowment Clergy Renewal Program," administered through the Christian Theological Seminary. This award of \$33,659.70 is to provide the means by which Pastor Jeff can pursue his upcoming Sabbatical planned for May 10, 2017 - August 6, 2017. Provided in the grant is \$12,000 to help pay the cost of having a guest pastor serve while Pastor Jeff is away.

The 11-page grant proposal submitted for this competitive program outlines a sabbatical theme based on the Benedictine way of life that calls for hospitality, study, prayer and work. Highlights of the sabbatical include study at Oxford University in England, participation in the Tantur Ecumenical Institute outside of Jerusalem and volunteering with Augusta Victoria hospital in Jerusalem.

"Lilly Endowment intends for this program to enable pastors to live for a while at a different pace and in a new environment, in Sabbath time and space," said Dr. Christopher L. Coble, vice president for religion at the Endowment. "We can think of no better way to honor these hardworking, faithful men and women than to help them experience personal growth and spiritual renewal in ways that they themselves design and find meaningful. We regularly hear that these renewal experiences are transformative for pastors, their families and their congregations." Congratulations to Pastor Jeff for receiving this prestigious grant!

#### Tell me more about this Sabbatical?

What is a pastor's sabbatical? A sabbatical is a time for rest and renewal to support future growth. The word sabbatical has its roots in the biblical concept of Sabbath ("to rest" or "to cease"). For Pastor Jeff, a sabbatical will be paid time off during which no teaching, preaching, or any other official duties will take place inside or outside the church.

Sabbatical leave is a time for Pastor Jeff to shift gears in order to rest, disengage, study, reflect and travel in order to return to minister among us refreshed and renewed in body, mind and spirit.

Sabbatical is not a vacation from meetings, budgets, sermons and people in need. It is a time for Pastor Jeff to receive spiritual nourishment – to deepen his relationship with God, himself and his family – a season of spiritual growth. This time can also be a season of growth for the entire congregation as we experience the gifts of a different pastor and take on heightened leadership responsibilities within the church.

What does a typical sabbatical look like? Within the Pacifica Synod, a typical pastoral sabbatical is normally for a period of three months and this is the length we negotiated with Pastor Jeff in his Letter of Call. Vacation time is not included as sabbatical time. The synod encourages pastors to include periods of total rest and relaxation, learning for the sake of learning and learning that will directly benefit the congregation within the sabbatical time.

Who will conduct worship services? Pastor Ernie Worman, we'll give you a full background on Pastor Ernie next month will be here to take over the duties of Word and Sacrament (Preaching and Holy Communion).

Who will provide day-to-day leadership and make decisions? Our very capable staff knows their duties well and can be expected to continue doing their jobs in Pastor Jeff's absence. The executive committee of the council and particularly the council president, will provide necessary leadership. Pastor Jeff will make sure that the executive committee and the supply pastor are informed of any anticipated special circumstances before his departure.

Will any congregational ministries/activities be cancelled or postponed during PJ's absence?

All ministries and committees of the congregation will continue to function as they normally do.

How will emergencies and congregational care be handled? Congregational care such as hospital/

nursing home/homebound visits and funerals will be a part of the guest pastor's responsibility. Pastor Ernie will share his contact information and will be living nearby in Dana Point.

Will we be able to have any contact with PJ during his sabbatical? In short: no. The intention of a sabbatical is for complete and unencumbered rest and renewal. Of course, say hello if you run into him stocking up on home improvement supplies at Lowe's or grabbing a Big-Gulp at 7-11!

### How can we make sure that the pastor's absence does not cause a decline in attendance or giving?

That's up to you! Continue to attend worship, meet your estimate of giving pledge, and invite your friends to worship! Take the opportunity to enjoy hearing sermons from a different perspective and be generous with your gifts!


How can we be sure Pastor Jeff will return at the end of his sabbatical? We know he will return because he says he will. One purpose of a sabbatical is to prevent the burnout that so often prompts a pastor to seek a new call or leave the ministry. Our Sabbatical policy requests that a pastor consider him/herself unavailable for call for the period of 12 months following the taking of Sabbatical leave.

I walked today where Jesus walked, And felt Him close to me. -Geoffrev O'Hara



### April Kid's Page

### JESUS IS **RISEN!**

When Jesus' disciples saw that the stone was rolled away from his tomb, they knew he had risen. Make a moveable tomb to celebrate Easter.

#### What you need:

- 4 pieces of paper (brown, blue, black, yellow)
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Glue stick
- Brad fastener
- Marker

#### What you do:

- 1. Fold the brown paper in half, short side to short side. Cut along the fold. On one half, draw and cut out a large half-circle (the tomb). On the other, draw and cut out a palm-sized circle (the stone).
- 2. Glue the brown tomb onto the blue paper.
- 3. Cut a black circle (the inside of the tomb) the same size as the brown stone and glue it onto the brown tomb.
- 4. Place the brown stone over the black half-circle; this is the entrance. Push the brad through one edge so the stone can move from side to side.
- 5. Cut out a cross from the yellow paper and glue it by the tomb.
- 6. Write "Jesus is risen!" atop the blue paper.
