"But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, 5 he saved us, not because of any works of righteousness that we had done, but according to his mercy, through the water[a] of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit."

Titus 3.4-5

In 1534 Martin Luther preached 6 sermons on Holy Baptism. In a publication of these sermons Luther said, that he was pleased to preach on the "honorable sacrament of Holy Baptism," which is to be acknowledged and treasured by Christians as their "greatest treasure on earth." He further stated, "I will not ground baptism on my faith, but rather my faith is grounded and built upon baptism." I don't know about you but these two statements about baptism are quite powerful; and need as much reflection today as they did 500 years ago.

In fact in the Large Catechism Martin Luther wrote, "In baptism, therefore, every Christian has enough to study and practice all his or her life. Christians always have enough to do to believe firmly what baptism promises and brings—victory over death and the devil, forgiveness of sin, God's grace, the entire Christ, and the Holy Spirit with his gifts. In short, the blessings of baptism are so boundless that if our timid nature considers them, it may well doubt whether they could all be true."

Luther was convinced that an attack on the promise of baptism—suggesting that it is mere water—was equal to an attack on the divinity of Christ. We hold that baptism is efficacious in the life of the Christian, that it is not merely a ritual, but it is a means of Grace. It is a visible means by which God not only adopts us into the family, pronounces salvation, saves us from sin, death and the devil but also grants us the gift of eternal life. We however often forget the power of baptism, in favor of pretending that salvation and heaven itself comes to us because of our good works, our faithfulness, our decisions. We prefer to place our faith in what we do and therefore disparage what Christ has done and offered.

Do you remember the story of Naaman the Syrian in

2 Kings chapter 5? He travels a long way to be healed by the prophet Elisha of his leprosy. Upon meeting Elisha, he becomes angry when the cure that Elisha offers is too simple. Naaman would climb a high mountain, be tested by feats of strength, he would do anything to show his worthiness of a cure! Yet, all he is told to do is to wash in the river. You see the cure, the gift, the healing is not based on Naaman; but is based on the power of God! So it is with Holy Baptism. Can God really be that merciful, that loving, that faithful, or do we find ourselves begrudging his generosity? (Matthew 20.15).

During Lent at our midweek devotions we looked at how the Holy Spirit, having been given to us in baptism compels us to live as God's people in the world. We explored our answer to the 5 questions that we ask: "Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism: To,

- **live** among God's faithful people;
- **hear** the word of God and share in the Lord's Supper;
- **proclaim** the good news of God in Christ through word and deed;
- serve all people following the example of Jesus; and
- **strive** for justice and peace in all the earth?"

At Easter we have moved the Baptismal Font to it's traditional place in the entrance way to the Nave. Not just as a piece of furniture; but as a powerful witness to this sacrament as our entrance into the community. As a reminder to the means by which we have been claimed by God in Christ and given all the benefits of God's promised salvation. The accessible font gives us encouragement to return to baptism regularly. Its water reminds us that God has given us new birth and that just as Naaman's healing wasn't dependent on his good works, so our salvation comes from the faithfulness of God.

Remembering our baptism as we enter worship, we see the table of Holy Communion in front of us. We are encouraged to connect God's gift of adopting us into the family, with the gift of being welcomed at

the family table as we receive the very presence of Christ, which reminds us of God's continued faithfulness as we journey through life. As we leave worship we once again are reminded of the "greatest treasure on earth" which God so freely gives!

As you leave worship during this Easter season it is my hope that seeing the font you remember that you have been baptized, named and claimed, to love your neighbor even as Christ loves us. Kirsi Stjerna from our seminary says: "Baptism is at the center of Luther's theological nervous system; it connects with every other vital thread in the theological map. Baptism is a mystery and a matter of faith; it calls for a philosophical imagination and mystical willingness to grasp the questions of reality beyond what meets the eye." Whether you dip your fingers in the water or not, may you enter and leave this place knowing that you are a baptized, loved, forgiven child of God!

Thank you for your time, gifts and talents as we share the love of Christ in the world. Well done!





Youth and Children's Page

We've Gone International!

The youth ministry of Our Savior's has always had a heart and a passion for service for those that are less fortunate than us; it is Christ's way and what we are called to do. While there are certainly many people in our own community that need our help, on April 21, 2018 we stepped our service up a notch. In the wee, small hours of that April morning seven of us from Our Savior's joined others from Community Lutheran in Rancho Santa Margarita and hopped on the "Strong Tower Ministry" bus and headed down to Baja, Mexico for a very eye opening day of service in the local community.

Our day started at 5:15am in the OSLC parking lot where we met our partners in ministry and left the relative safety and comfort of San Clemente, pointed the bus toward the border and hit the road. We arrived at Puerta Hermosa, an orphanage just south of Ensenada that caters to abandoned kids suffering from brain damage. This is a purposely small operation (just 7 kids) in order to create more of a family environment for these kids who stand virtually no chance of ever leaving this facility. We met the kids and staff but were only there for a short time, we had other work to do.

We then got back on board our "Disciple-ship" (the bus) and continued south to a rural area where the camp "Genesis Diaz" is located. Genesis Diaz is a non-profit Christian camp that caters to the orphan community from all over Baja. At Genesis Diaz, where we spent most of the day, we helped build cabins for the campers that will be arriving soon. We also got to eat lunch with some of the kids and staff that are already using a completed area of the camp. While it was a lot of work our kids and adults leaned into it and did their tasks with joyful hearts and smiling faces, they were awesome!

"These smiling lights of Christ showed me that no matter the circumstances, God provides and shows us love on the daily. Just by walking around these projects that these ministries are working on and hearing how much these hospitals/orphanages/housing etc. are needed and wanted really opened my eyes to how fortunate and blessed we are to have the things that we do."

After we completed our work at the camp we once again boarded the bus and headed over to "Door of Faith", the largest non-profit orphanage in Baja. Door of Faith houses over 100 orphans ranging in age from newborns to teens. Each age and gender group has their own dormitory which also houses a host family that lives with the kids of that demographic. With the possible exception of the newborns, none of the kids at Door of Faith will ever be adopted, this is their home. The folks that run the orphanage insist that all of the kids go to school and least graduate high school. Any student that wishes to continue with higher education is offered that opportunity as well and many have completed their undergraduate degrees and some have continued into medical or law school. Many of them also come back with families of their own and live as host families in the dorms that they themselves grew up in. They have their own bakery (there is a birthday every three days there) as well as a barber shop (the kids all look great), a medical office, a chapel, and a dental office. It really is a small city within itself and the kids seem happy and loved.

Our final stop before leaving Mexico was to eat some AWESOME street tacos in Tijuana just before crossing back into the U.S.

We arrived back at Our Savior's around 10:00pm, exhausted but filled.
