And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making all things new." Revelation 21.5a

The more I study scripture and the history of the Christian faith the more I am convinced that ours is an ongoing story of death and resurrection; which finds its zenith in the story of Jesus Christ. Our sacred scripture (Bible) tells us that God creates the world good and able to thrive in mutual dependence. Order over comes chaos as the Spirit (wind) of God hovers over the waters and light begins to illumine the handy work of God. Soon we see brokenness invading the goodness of God's world as human beings show their lack of trust in God. This lack of trust not only changes the address of Adam and Eve but it changes the relationship that human beings had enjoyed with God. Delight in creaturely existence has given way to fear and suspicion that God is more to be feared than loved. And so the first death, followed by a resurrection moment when God will not abandon his creation but provides clothing and the means for their continued survival.

In only a few more chapters we get the story of Noah and the great flood. Once again a creation that was meant to be good and in relationship with the other parts of creation has lost its way. God looks down on the wickedness that had come about and in God's sovereignty judges the world with a great flood that leaves Noah and his family to carry on. Death and resurrection.

The people of creation go out into the world with one voice and decide that instead of spreading out as God has commanded they will stick together and build a tower tall enough to threaten even God in the heavenly places. The tower of Babel represents yet another moment of distrust by humans and so God confuses their languages and spreads them out into the world to make their own way. Death and resurrection.

Later on the Bible tells us that Abraham was as good as dead, when in his late nineties he and Sarah have a child. Death and resurrection. Or take the people of Israel who were slaves in Egypt for nearly 400 years, or the wandering in the wilderness for 40 years, or Ezekiel's valley of dry bones, or the return after exile, or the rebuilding of the Temple; over and over scripture tells the story of that which was good, having been seduced or at least influenced by that which was no longer good and Godly, thereby there is a death and a resurrection.

Ultimately it is God who comes to us in the person

of Jesus Christ. He comes to bring the light, love and salvation of God to the world that God loves. Everything should be wonderful with the coming of Jesus. But do you remember "What Child Is This" that we sang at Christmas?

"Good Christian, fear; for sinners here
The silent word is pleading.
Nails, spear shall pierce him through,
The cross he borne for me, for you;
Hail, hail the word made flesh,
The babe, the son of Mary!

Even in the midst of our Christmas joy we know that death and resurrection will be a part of the life of Jesus.

And so on Pentecost we are once again reminded of this cycle of death and rebirth. A small group of believers who have been living in fear are given a voice and faith to proclaim Jesus as Lord. It is not that God is not faithful (death) but that God continues to be at work creating and providing and gifting each and every generation (Resurrection). We continue to live in a world of death and resurrection. Things change and long established ways of being are challenged and in such change we witness the resurrection of Jesus Christ right before our eyes.

Let us not be the people of despair; but the people who know the handiwork of God. Let us be people who have come to realize that God is still and will always be at work in our world, in our church and in our lives. While the season of Easter has given way to the days of Pentecost may we keep an eye out for the new thing that God is doing, the new opportunities that God sends, and the chance to participate in healing and restoration. Maybe this is a partial way to understand what Jesus means when he said, "Let the dead bury their own dead." That is, we'll not so much mourn the changes as we'll rejoice in the prospects that God provides.

Come Holy Spirit and bring the new life of resurrection! Amen

When the people of God were about to leave Egypt God gave them permission to take what they needed—to plunder the Egyptians for resources that would be useful. In our modern day Social Media and technology give us tools that we can “plunder” and use for the Kingdom of God.

Think about this: On a given Sunday a pastor preaches to a congregation of 200 people or so. However if the members of the church all checked in on Facebook when they come to worship, all of their friends would see it and could what happened on Sunday could become a subject to talk about it in the week to come. If other members tweeted one of the pastor's insights from the sermon, or a Bible passage, or a lyric from a hymn, then thousands of people would also learn from that insight. And if someone posted a picture of an uplifting moment to Instagram, all sorts of conversations could happen about the work God is doing.

The worship of the church is a public act. Social media allows us to reach the world and engage people far beyond the church doors with the word we are encountering in worship. So go ahead, post, tweet, gram, even snapchat what happens at church and help spread the word throughout the world!
